

We were thrilled to celebrate Anawim's 30th anniversary last year. We had a wonderful celebration commemorating all of what we have done to get us to where we are today. But we are all well aware that there is much more to be done not only in Des Moines, but also other communities as we seek to meet the growing need of affordable housing.

As 2017 ended, we marked the completion of two major projects in Des Moines. First was our 30-unit Brickstones at Riverbend development serving households at 55 and above and the second was our Legacy Park development serving 137 family households. 2018 expands our development footprint as we are building homes in Sioux City, Cedar Rapids and Ottumwa. These combined will add 150 new units to our portfolio. Our goal is to continue to create affordable housing opportunities for those in need. We are

fortunate to be able to build off the success of our past thirty years and meet the needs of hundreds of households both here in central lowa and now throughout the state.

In our permanent supportive housing programs, we are proud to continue using the Housing First model. Housing First is a recovery-oriented approach that offers permanent, affordable housing as quickly as possible for individuals and families experiencing homelessness. The method also provides supportive services and connections to community-based support so personal needs can be addressed, self-sufficiency can begin and a return to homelessness can be avoided.

Thank you for your continuing partnership with us. We hope to see you soon and share more about our transformative work.

Many of our families require help from a translator. All wanting a safe, comfortable, affordable place to call home.

PROPERTY MANAGEMENT

Our property management services offer outside housing developments and organizations quality and knowledgeable property managers with years of compliance expertise. Property management allows Anawim Housing additional funds to help directly sustain our programs and family services in Greater Des Moines.

PROPERTY DEVELOPMENT

Our expertise includes acquiring and developing new development sites as well as renovating and preserving existing homes and apartment units. We have compliance experts on staff, as well as a proven track record in meeting needed requirements. consulting services, Anawim helps clients navigate the unique financial structure of the Low Income Housing Tax Credit. Three of Anawim's properties appear on the National Register of Historic Places:

The Maine, Kromer Flats, and New Lawn. While over a third of our housing is new construction, many of our homes are well over 100 years old and are well maintained and restored by our property services technicians. In 2018, Anawim is expanding outside of Des Moines, meeting an even greater statewide need for affordable, quality housing. Together these projects total 150 additional units in Cedar Rapids, Ottumwa, and Sioux City.

PROGRAMS

PERMANENT SUPPORTIVE
HOUSING PROGRAMS

For more than 20 years, Anawim has provided permanent supportive housing programs. Today, we manage over 250 permanent supportive housing units. These units house families as well as individuals who come from homelessness and suffer from either a mental illness, substance abuse, HIV and/or defined as medically fragile. Upon referral through Centralized Intake, the supportive program staff meets regularly with participants, helping them on the road to self-sufficiency.

HOUSING OPPORTUNITIES PROGRAM 1 & 2

Anawim began Housing Opportunities Program (HOP) 1 in 2016 and HOP2 in 2017. Together, these programs housed 76 chronically homeless individuals in Permanent Supportive Housing in 2017. These programs are funded through the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). Program managers provide case management services in order to address housing stability.



HOMELESS TO HOUSING

Homeless to Housing started in 2015 and housed 22 chronically homeless individuals in 2017. Anawim program manager provides case management services targeted to stabilize long-term homeless individuals.

Anawim Housing's Family Services program helps tenants gain access to community resources, education and employment opportunities that support overall wellbeing. The programs we offer function very much like a support system for our tenants.

Some of the unique programs available to our tenants include:

SISTER STELLA RENTAL RELIEF FUND

Provides rental assistance for tenants during a time of life crisis that would otherwise jeopardize their housing.

FAMILY WELLNESS

A unique program that provides both educational and recreational opportunities for individuals and families to strengthen their physical and mental well-being. Wellness activities can include family passes to the zoo, tickets to shows, music lessons, etc.

COMMUNITY GARDENS

Anawim offers several community gardening experiences for tenants. This provides an opportunity for families to grow fresh produce, be outdoors and get better acquainted with their neighbors.

HOUSEWARMING PROGRAM

Each tenant receives a "Welcome Home" basket filled with cleaning supplies and other items to help tenants feel welcome in their new home.


