These tours are incredibly important to us, as it allows community members to see our homes and discover the scope of services and programs we offer.

We are honored to be the place where they choose to call home. By joining us on a tour, you will get to walk through the front door where a new family will soon call home.

This spring's tour will include a stop at our newly completed Brickstones at Riverbend building located at 6th Ave. & Forest Ave. This 30 unit senior housing project just opened in January. Come see firsthand all of the great work Anawim is doing in our community. We hope you can join us.

Over 64% of Anawim's households are single-mother-led and this unique group of women support these households in a variety of ways. Anawim staff are available for all tenants who need access to resources in the community that best fit their needs.

Each year, the WEF Group hosts two events in the spring and fall. These events are a wonderful opportunity to learn about the WEF Group, enjoy a beautiful evening with friends, and hear inspiring stories from staff and board members. Each event also collects household items that are given to tenants in need.

For as long as Jordyn could remember, her life had been a circle of continuous abuse, neglect, homelessness and drug addiction. She has since stepped leaps and bounds into a new life - one with her own home, her kids by her side and a growing support system. She begins her story by stating, "I'm Jordyn. And I grew up with every type of abuse there was. Period."

Born and raised in Cheyenne, Wyoming, Jordyn had a rough home life. She was raised primarily by her grandparents, until they chose to place her in adolecent treatment at age 14, from which she ran away and became homeless at age 18. From there, she fell into several violent and unhealthy domestic relationships and became addicted to drugs. At 20, she had her oldest son Joel. The domestic abuse and drug use worsened over the next several years, during which she gave birth to two more children. Things began to spiral out of control for Jordyn,who had her kids taken from her, spent time in jail and then moved to Iowa in the pursuit of regaining parental rights to her kids who had been taken there.

In Iowa, with nowhere to live, no money, no family, she found herself homeless again. She would sleep in garages, parks, or "friends" houses only if she provided them with drugs. During her homelessness, she gave birth to a daughter, Kamryn. It was then that she became committed to making a change and reached out for help.

She entered a successful recovery and treatment program, after which she stayed in an emergency shelter. Soon after, she was referred to Anawim Housing through Centralized Intake and was introduced to Cindy McGrane, Senior Program Manager. Cindy was immediately impressed with her.

Upon entering Anawim's Program and moving into her own two bedroom duplex, Jordyn was able to regain custody of her oldest son Joel, who now stays with her and his baby sister Kamryn.

It's been a great help to be with Anawim. Now I don't have to be in those situations that I was in before. It's just me and my children now.

Every day is a step in a more positive direction. Jordyn and her kids are very active in their church, where she also participates in a Celebrate Recovery program. Together the family loves playing on their nearby school playground, and enjoying a much calmer, steadier life.

When asked what her vision of a happy life is, Jordyn says, "I think I'm living it. Now. You know, yes I'd like to go back to school, get a vehicle, go back to work. But right now, I'm happy with where I'm at." Cindy reassures her that she has no doubt those things will come, a little at a time.

Being able to give hope to others who are going through similar situations is something that Jordyn feels strongly about. With so much hope to share, she says,

Don't be ashamed of where you are coming from. Don't be ashamed of what you are going through. Embrace every opportunity you have and start reaching out. The more you reach out, the more you can get help.

## OPENING DOORS



Opening Doors celebrates the journeys from homelessness to hope experienced by thousands of people in Polk County. On November 15, 2017, the Adult Recipient Award went to Kenny, an Anawim Housing Permanent Supportive Housing Program tenant. Anawim Program Manager Dan McBee nominated Kenny for this award.

Kenny's story is a remarkable one of hope as he struggled with homelessness for the majority of his life. He has since began to make great strides and find stability after moving into his own home through Anawim's Program in 2015 and working with

### Foundation Dollars At Work

Permanent Supportive Housing Programs

Each year, Anawim Housing applies for housing program grants through the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). We are fortunate to be able to administer five program grants through these funds and provide a home for more than 300 households. However, the grant requires Anawim Housing to provide a 7% administrative financial match. Each year, your donations help to provide this required match.

In 2018, we will serve more households in our permanent supportive housing programs than ever before! While this is incredibly exciting news for our community, our required match dollars have increased. We hope you consider supporting the Anawim Housing Foundation this year, as funds go towards supporting these programs and the tenants we serve.

We look forward to continuing to provide solutions for those experiencing homelessness and working with them on their path to stability.

We are excited to pursue the mission of Anawim that we have been so successful providing in Des Moines to other parts of the state and serving lowans. These projects will allow Anawim to utilize the funds derived from these projects to strengthen our financial footing and provide more services to those in need in Des Moines.
