

Curtis' Story

Curtis was a tenant of Anawim Housing's Pioneer Woods community for 7 years. Curtis is a retired electrician and Air Force Veteran. Just in time for the holidays, Curtis was able to become a homeowner through Greater Des Moines Habitat for Humanity.

Curtis grew up in Detroit, but due to crime and violence decided it was time to leave. Two people were shot by the side of his house one night in Detroit, and that was his breaking point. In November of 2005, Curtis took a bus to Des Moines, with nothing but a suitcase and his electrician tools. He left his truck behind, and a house full of furniture. When Curtis got to Des Moines, he had no plan, beyond leaving Detroit and building a life in Iowa. He arrived in Des Moines two days before Thanksgiving. He was able to find open shelters for a few days, until he got in contact with Veterans Affairs, where he received housing assistance for homeless Veterans. Curtis was able to find work in Des Moines and was able to financially support himself.

A year later, when Curtis had housing stability, he went back to Detroit to get his daughter and bring her back to Des Moines. Curtis is an amazing and supportive father, continuing to care for his special needs daughter, Tasha. In 2007, Curtis was looking for a larger place for him and his daughter, and that is when Primary Health Care recommended Anawim Housing.

"The back yard is what sold me at Pioneer Woods, I loved it." Curtis took a bus out to Pioneer Woods on Des Moines' Southeast side.

When he turned the corner to look at his potential home for the first time, he was sold immediately – the beautiful quiet neighborhood with planted flowers and a playground on site.

"Anawim Housing has been very good to me. If I'm paying money to an organization or business, I want professionalism and quality service, and that's what I got from Anawim Housing. The maintenance work force was always friendly and came when I called, and my property manager has been an exceptional housing manager throughout the years."

Curtis and Tasha are now homeowners in Des Moines' Easter Lake neighborhood. They are very excited to lay down roots on the Southeast side. "I have a peace of mind in Des Moines," says Curtis,

is excited to announce our new Legacy Project on 6th Avenue.

We will be breaking ground this **Thursday, April 23.**

The Legacy Project is located at 1511-1521 6th Avenue. Currently at this site sits an uninhabitable home that needs to be torn down, and an empty lot. In its place will be six, three-bedroom townhomes. Anawim Housing has had our sights set on the 6th avenue corridor for quite some time. The goal of revitalizing that area came way before this week's groundbreaking – some of the first homes Anawim Housing purchased and remodeled were duplexes and historic apartment buildings on 6th Avenue over 20 years ago. We intend to continue our revitalization efforts on 6th avenue – and carry on our commitment to improve the look and quality of the neighborhood.

The townhomes will provide a mix of five market rate units and one affordable unit at 30% of the area median income (AMI). We intend to make the market rate units at a reasonable rent, so they are no higher than that of our typical affordable housing units at 60% AMI. These homes will be affordable, quality homes near commerce, bus routes and in close proximity to Downtown Des Moines.

Our goal is to impact the neighborhood and spark interest in more development, city infill and renovations by beginning with this Legacy Project. The townhomes will also serve a need in the community. It will add a diverse housing stock in the neighborhood, which is much desired for those looking for safe, affordable and quality housing near downtown Des Moines.

This Legacy Project will be privately funded through new and existing
Legacy Campaign funds and other sources. The Legacy Project was
unveiled at our Spring Legacy Event, showing our current and
prospective Legacy donors what they are/could be supporting.

The Anawim Housing Foundation has an exciting year ahead of them. They will continue raising funds for both the ongoing needs of Anawim Housing's programs and services, as well as long term needs for both our properties and people.

As of January 2015, all donations to Anawim Housing are now donated through the Anawim Housing Foundation. The Anawim Housing Foundation is led by a committed board of directors who are dedicated to managing the donations entrusted to the foundation—guaranteeing that 100% of annual fund donor dollars go to the programs and services Anawim Housing provides, directly impacting the families, individuals and children Anawim Housing serves.



STAFF HIGHLIGHT

Most know that Anawim Housing is an affordable housing provider, but did you know that we also manage programs for the City of Des Moines that help individuals and families in a housing crisis in the Des Moines community?

Anawim Housing currently manages eight homeless programs for the city of Des Moines, totaling over 200 scattered site units of families and individuals that would otherwise be in a shelter or in some other housing crisis. Tenants in these programs get to choose what area of Des Moines they would like to live. Program managers find a home for them that fit their needs, and Anawim rents the unit - becoming responsible for both the tenant and the home they are living in. Participants in these programs are referred to Anawim through their case managers.

Coming this summer, Anawim will be taking on its ninth program. This ninth program will add 18 house-

Anawim Housing provides to tenant families and

holds, and will focus on housing the individuals that have been chronically homeless for an extended period of time.

We manage several programs that focus on both families and individuals in a housing crisis. Over 46% of the individuals in our programs are children.

The Anawim Housing Staff that run our programs are Bill Swanson, VP of Operations, Cynthia Latcham, Senior Program Manager, and Kara Wilcoxon, Program Manager. Through one-on-one job training, resume building, frequent in-home visits, and collaboration with case managers, these staff members work with each family or individual and help them on the hard road from homelessness to stability. The goal of all of the supportive housing programs Anawim manages is to help them "graduate" on to a higher payment of rent and self-reliance.
